### **Results achieved at the country level 2023 Orange Book of Results**

Executive Director Annual Report to the Executive Board

#### *Summary*

This document includes a selection of UNFPA programme results achieved at the country level in 2023. The results were selected mostly at the output level, capturing the UNFPA support in (a) developing laws, policies, strategies, and accountability mechanisms, (b) developing systems and tools, (c) strengthening the skills and capacities of duty-bearers and service providers and (d) benefiting communities with services.

## I. Introduction

This annex highlights over 1,000 key results achieved at the country and sub-regional levels, with the support of UNFPA in 2023 during 2023. It covers results only at the country programme output level. These results include (a) changing the laws, policies, plans, strategies, programmes, and accountability frameworks; (b) developing and adjusting the national and subnational systems and tools; (c) strengthening the skills and capacities of duty-bearers and service providers; and (d) ensuring immediate benefits for the rights-holders.

The results reported here are limited to a maximum of six per country even though a country may have achieved more than six results. The UNFPA support is defined mainly as technical or financial support to a country. In some instances, however, the support is in the form of coordination.
