Progress in implementing the UNFPA strategic plan, 2022-2025

Report of the Executive Director

Summary

This document includes a selection of key output level results achieved at the country level in 2022 in partnership with governments, civil society organizations, and women- and youth-led organizations.

I. Background

1. In 2022, UNFPA embarked on the first year of implementing the second of three consecutive strategic plans that calls for the acceleration of the three transformative results: (a) ending the unmet need for family planning; (b) ending preventable maternal deaths; and (c) ending gender-based violence and all harmful practices. UNFPA has operationalized six interconnected outputs to accelerate the achievement of the three transformative results: (a) policy and accountability; (b) quality of care and services; (c) gender and social norms; (d) population change and data; (e) humanitarian action; and (f) adolescents and youth.
2. UNFPA remains committed to strengthening transparency and accountability as key principles for achieving the outcome and outputs results of the strategic plan.
3. The section II of this annex consists of over 700 output level immediate results achieved during 2022 within 119 offices and 2 sub regional offices in partnerships with governments, civil society organizations, women- and youth-led organizations. The results were also achieved in line with the priorities set in the country programme documents that were aligned with the strategic plan, 2022-2025.
4. The overall UNFPA achievements at the outcome level are reflected in figure 1 of the main report of the Executive Director on the implementation of the strategic plan, 2022-2025.
