Extensions of country programmes

Summary

The present note contains information on the extensions of UNFPA country programmes. First-time extensions of country programmes up to one year are approved by the Executive Director and presented to the Executive Board for information. All other requests for extensions of country programmes are submitted to the Executive Board for approval.

The Executive Board may wish to take note of the first-time extensions of the country programmes for Lebanon, Libya, South Sudan, and Tunisia, as presented in table 1, and may wish to approve the second extension of the country programme for Yemen, the fourth extensions of the country programmes for Burkina Faso and Myanmar, the fifth extension of the country programme for the Democratic People's Republic of Korea as well as the fifth, two-year extension of the country programme for Afghanistan as presented in table 2.
