#### Multilateral agreements with inherited reduced cost-recovery rates<sup>20</sup>

- 5. In 2021, United Nations system organizations (including pooled funds and interorganizational transfers) contributed \$247.4 million to UNFPA, becoming the organization's top donor to other resources for the fourth year in a row (2020: \$271.6 million). These results demonstrate UNFPA investment and readiness to advance United Nations development system reform, while continuing to prioritize joint-up mechanisms to effectively implement the common chapter with the United Nations system organizations, and deliver on the Sustainable Development Goals and the 2030 Agenda.
- 6. This trend, however, continues having an impact on the effective cost-recovery rates inherited by UNFPA from agreements between United Nations system organizations and their donors, when parts of contributed amounts are subsequently transferred to UNFPA. The table below provides a summary of multilateral agreements with inherited reduced cost-recovery rates signed by UNFPA in the last three years with the associated financial impact:
