Flexible resources for high-impact results

Germany's flexible contributions enable UNFPA to act with foresight and agility where needs are greatest. In 2024, Germany was UNFPA's second-largest core donor and supported key initiatives like the Maternal and Newborn Health Fund, the UNFPA Supplies Partnership, and the Joint Programme to Eliminate FGM, ensuring quality care for mothers and newborns, freedom of reproductive choice for women and adolescent girls, and protection from gender-based violence and harmful practices.

Spearheading critical emergency response

Through core and humanitarian funding, including to the Humanitarian Thematic Fund, Germany helped UNFPA deliver life-saving services to millions of vulnerable women, girls, and young people, bringing direct assistance and care in crisis settings.

Driving women's health innovations

Germany is helping close global gaps in sexual and reproductive health research and development through financial support to the Equalizer Accelerator Fund and political advocacy for the Equity 2030 Alliance, and WomenX Collective.
