In 2024, the United States provided critical support for UNFPA's humanitarian response, supporting life-saving services in crises such as Afghanistan, Gaza, Sudan, Ukraine, and Yemen. U.S. contributions reached over 25 countries—primarily emergency settings—helping deliver essential sexual and reproductive health services and protection from gender-based violence. As UNFPA's largest humanitarian donor, providing nearly half of total humanitarian funding, the U.S. significantly strengthened response capacity at field and global levels.
