Through its feminist foreign policy, Luxembourg advocates for human rights, gender equality, and youth empowerment. In collaboration with UNFPA, Luxembourg supports essential initiatives across Africa, Latin America, and Asia—such as the Joint Programme on Female Genital Mutilation and targeted youth projects in Burkina Faso, Niger and Rwanda—that prevent gender-based violence, eliminate harmful practices, and equip adolescent girls with life skills to reach their full potential.
