


# Core and Non-Core Contributions 2015-2024<sup>1</sup>

Millions of USS





Because of this change, all figures for both core and non-core resources in 2023 are shown as contributions received, i.e. the amount of cash transferred to UNFPA in a given year. The figures for 2022 have been restated to also reflect contributions received to allow for comparability of data between 2022 and 2023. Data prior to 2022 remain shown as revenue figures, i.e., amounts recognized as revenue in the year in which the agreements were signed.





Number of Donor Governments That Have Committed to UNFPA's Core Resources






### **Top 20 Donor Contributions to Non-Core Resources**


#### **Top 20 Donor Combined Core and Non-Core Contributions**

## **Top 20 Donors to Non-Core Humanitarian Resources**




# **Top 20 Donors to Global Thematic Funds**
